

ALEXANDER, OLIVER GORDON

July 12, 1888-December 14, 1957

O.G. Alexander died December 14, 1957, at Wheatland General Hospital from injuries he received in a two-car collision, 3 miles north of Wheatland, at 1:45 p.m., Dec. 12. Mr. Alexander was traveling south and made a left-hand turn as a 1958 Pontiac driven by Herman E. Bouchie, attempted to pass.

The Bouchie car struck the Alexander pickup in the left front, pushing the pickup to the right, at which time Mr. Alexander was thrown from the truck, the truck then turning over on him. He lived approximately 45 hours after being rushed to the hospital.

Oliver Gordon Alexander was born July 12, 1888, in Bassett, Nebr., the son of Thomas and Katherine Gordon Alexander. His parents were both born in Scotland. Mr. Alexander had made his home in Wyoming since 1920 and was a livestock buyer and trucker by trade.

He is survived by his wife, June Curtis Alexander; one step-son, Robert B. Curtis, Torrington; one daughter, Mrs. Katherine Strelow, Bassett, Nebr.; two step-daughters, Mrs. Edith Graves, Wheatland and Mrs. Marion Clouse, North Platte, Nebr., ten grandchildren and 4 great grandchildren.

Funeral services were held Tuesday, December 17, at 2:00 p.m. from the Schrader Chapel with R.J. Clouse officiating. Internment was in the Wheatland cemetery with pallbearers being Wm. Graves, Jr., Gary Graves, Frank Graves, Jack Clouse, Preston Hiatt and Jack Bruegman.
