

CALL, JOSEPH JAMES
March 6, 1886-October 23, 1961

Joseph J. Call, 75, succumbed Monday at Platte Memorial hospital shortly after being admitted. His sudden passing came as a shock to friends who had seen him around Wheatland on Sunday.

Born in Cleveland, Ohio, March 6, 1886, the deceased had lived in Platte county since 1937. Prior to that, he had resided in Albany county, having come to Wyoming as a lad of 16.

He was a member of the Catholic Church, the Moose Lodge, and the Knights of Columbus.

Funeral services were conducted from the St. Patrick's Catholic church in Wheatland on Wednesday at 10 a.m. with Father Leonard Wren officiating. Burial was in the Wheatland cemetery.

Pallbearers were Bernard Bowen, Art Richard, Roland See, Joe Saverine, Arlo Bowen and Joe Dyer.

The survivors include two daughters, Mrs. Mack (Annella) Jones of Wheatland and Mrs. Raymond (Claire) Nilsen of Casper. There also survive one sister, Mrs. Tillie Dugas of Cleveland, Ohio and 7 grandchildren. One daughter, Mrs. Tillie Jones, preceded him in death.
