

## Ida Doris Clack, 72, Succumbs To Extended Illness

Ida Doris Clack, 72, succumbed to an extended illness Sunday, February 13, 1972 at the Platte County Memorial Hospital.

Born September 12, 1899 in England, Mrs. Clack spent her youth in England and lived in the Tower of London, where her father was a Beefeater in the Tower. During World War I, she joined the Women's Air Force in England. She married Charles F. Clack and they had five children born to this union. A resident of Wheatland since 1961, Mrs. Clack lived in Summerville, N. J. prior to moving here.

A member of the Episcopal Church, she also belonged to the WTK Club, Golden Age Club and the Jolly Janes Club.

Funeral services were held Wednesday, February 16, 1972 at 11:00 a.m. at the Schrader Chapel with the Rev. Ernest Biller officiating. Interment was at the Wheatland Cemetery with Roy Hitt, Harold Hoffman, Joe Wilcox, Kenneth Kennedy, Cecil Walthall and Kohn Artery serving as pallbearers.
