

CLARK, RAYMOND I.

The community will be saddened to learn of the death on Friday morning at 3:30 o'clock of Ray Clark, son of Mrs. Chas. Clark. The young man was suffering from peritonitis following an abscessed appendix. He was operated immediately of the discovery of the trouble, and made a gallant fight for life; but he had been sick for some time, treating himself without realizing the trouble was serious, so that the entire system was thoroughly poisoned. The boy's very courage and unwillingness to be a "quitter" betrayed him. It was another sad case of too late.

The bereavement of his mother, Mrs. Chas. Clark, is particularly heart-rending in that she is a widow, and herself very ill, and much dependent on Ray. The sixteen year old lad had played the part of a man in many ways and was a son whom any mother would be proud. Besides the mother, he is survived by an older brother and a little sister.
