

COLE, CHARLES CLIFFORD
October 8, 1884-August 17, 1939

Funeral services were conducted Saturday by the Lingle lodge No. 37 AF and AM in the Wheatland Masonic temple for Clifford Cole who died August 17 at Buffalo after a 6 months illness.

Mr. Cole, who would have been 55 on Oct. 8, passed away in Buffalo and his body brought here Friday.

Charles Clifford Cole was born October 8, 1881 (4) in Green City, Sullivan county, Mo. He was married August 20, 1914 to Hattie May Webb, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Joe Webb of Wheatland. On Sunday they would have celebrated their silver wedding anniversary.

After their marriage the Coles lived in Wheatland several years and in Lingle. Mr. Cole at one time employed at the Miller store located in the building now occupied by the Golden Rule store. They have lived in Buffalos for the past year and half.

While in Lingle Mr. Cole received his degrees in the Masonic lodge. He also belonged to Wyoming Consistory at Cheyenne and Kalif Temple AAONMS at Sheridan. Members of the Lingle lodge which gave him his degree work also conducted his funeral.

Out-of-state members of his family attending the funeral were Lee B. Cole of Cleveland, Ohio, and John Be. Cole of Midwest. He leaves his wife, another brother Ora of Newport, Arkansas, and two sisters, Mrs. Ora Lucas of Powersville, Mo. and Elizabeth Cole of Kansas City, Mo.

Burial was made in the local cemetery with Watson and Dennis in charge of arrangements.
