

COPLEY, LAURENS WINDSOR JR.  
November 23, 1919-August 2, 1965

Laurens Windsor (Bud) Copley died at the Salt Lake City Hospital Monday, August 2, following a sudden illness. A former Wheatland resident, he had made his home in Provo and Salt Lake City the last eight years, where he was employed by the Geneva Steel Mill.

Born in Wheatland on November 23, 1919, he was a veteran of World War II having enlisted in the U.S. Navy, May 12, 1943. He received his discharge on December 16, 1945 with the rank of Pharm. Mate 1/c. He was affiliated with the Episcopal Church and was a member of B.P.O. Elks.

Funeral services were held August 6 at 10:30 a.m. in the Schrader Chapel with the Rev. Joseph Batten officiating. Burial was in the Wheatland cemetery with Bernard Bowen, Herb Merbach, Deb Wiggam, John Dunham, Ron Williams and Zack Phifer serving as pallbearers. Military services were held at the graveside.

Survivors include his wife, Edythe Amerman Copley of Salt Lake City, three children, Windsor, Ann and Lynn, all at home; his mother, Mrs. Puma Copley, and one sister, Mrs. Tom (Helen) Shepard of Riverton. His father, Laurens W. Copley preceded his in death in 1941.
