

CORMAN, JOHN ALLEN  
February 22, 1895-December 26, 1965

Dr. John Allen Corman, well known Wheatland dentist, succumbed in the Platte County Memorial hospital on Dec. 26, 1965 following a brief illness. Dr. Corman was born in Liberty, Mo. on Feb. 22, 1895 and was a World War I veteran and the American Legion and DAV.

He graduated from the University of Missouri at Kansas City in 1918, did post-graduate work at Denver, and started his practice of dentistry in Kansas City. He came to Wheatland for a short time then moved to Lusk where he practiced for about five years. He returned to Wheatland in 1929. He was married to Rebecca Thomas in 1933 at Kimball, Nebr.

Last rites were conducted by Rev. Henry Hartberg at the Schrader chapel on Dec. 29 at 2:00 p.m. with interment in the Wheatland cemetery. Pallbearers included Adam Lofing, A.L. Kendig, Ed Foreman, Lorin Guild, Al Erlandson and Robert Straw.

Surviving relatives include his wife Rebecca, sons, John A., Jr. and Richard; six grandchildren, three nieces and one nephew. His parents and two brothers preceded him in death.
