

CUNDALL, ALICE ANN RATCLIFF  
November 7, 1862-March 2, 1937

Alice Ann Ratcliff was born in Lucas county, Iowa, November 7, 1862, and departed this life March 2, 1937, aged 74 years, 3 months and 23 days.

She was one of a family of twelve children, only two of whom survive her. The family moved to Aurora, Nebraska in the spring of '71, and settled on a claim a mile east of the town.

On October 15, 1884, she was united in marriage to Harry Cundall at Aurora. They moved to Sutton, Nebraska on the spring of 1886, returning to Aurora later in the year. In June 1887, they moved to Stratton, Nebraska and from there to Kent, Washington where they lived a year. They then returned to Stratton, remaining there until they moved to Glendo, Wyoming in 1917.

In early life she united with the Episcopal church.

Five children were born to this union, two girls and three boys, all living, and with their father in his affliction.

She was a lover of home and family, thinking of the health, happiness and comfort of her loved ones before her own. In spite of her ill health which seemed constantly to pursue her during the past thirty years, she was ever a cheerful, helpful companion to husband and children. She was the balance wheel when their world seemed on an uneven keel.

She leaves to mourn her, her husband, five children, thirteen grandchildren, one sister and one brother, besides tried and true friends in unknown numbers.

Services will be held at the Congregation church at this place on tomorrow (Friday) at 1:30 and interment will be in the Wheatland cemetery.
