

1983 HOMER CURTIS

Services for Homer Curtis, 67, who died Dec. 7 in Wheatland were held Saturday, Dec. 10, in the United Methodist Church with the Reverend Virgil Lamm officiating.

Homer Hiatt Curtis was born in the Antelope Gap area of Wheatland June 21, 1916, the son of Homer M. and Etta L. Curtis. He was raised on the family farm and later farmed for Raymond Wilson before entering the U.S. Army during World War II where he served in France, Germany and North Africa.

Upon his discharge from the military he returned to Wheatland to farm his own place. He married Rebecca Lashmett, Sept. 8, 1947 in Rapid City, S.D.

The couple operated their farm until moving into Wheatland in 1962 when Homer began working at the Wheatlanes Bowling Alley which he later purchased, retiring in 1973.

He was a charter member of the Antelope Gap Grange and a member of the United Methodist Church.

Besides his wife, Becky, he is survived by two daughters: Lorene Sailer of Lafayette, La.; and Karlene Stugart of Wheatland, by two sisters; Margaret Marshall and Lucille Valentine, both of Wheatland and by three grandchildren.
