

## Thomas Royal Eastman

Services for Thomas Royal Eastman, 58, were held Friday, February 5, at the United Methodist Church in Wheatland, Wyo., with Reverend Les Ludlum officiating. Interment was in the Wheatland Cemetery.

Mr. Eastman died Tuesday, February 2, at the Poudre Valley Hospital in Ft. Collins, Colo.

Tom was born September 27, 1940, in Nashua, Mont., the son of Henry E. and Myrtle (Glenn) Eastman. He was reared and educated in Nashua; graduating from Nashua High School in 1958. Tom worked about a year and then married Myrna L. Carden on March 13, 1959, in Glasgow, Mont. In September, 1959, he joined the United States

Navy serving until 1963. Tom worked in the aerospace industry in California; for Boeing in Renton, Wash.; and he began his career as a maintenance electrician working for Avco at Glasgow Air Base in Glasgow. In 1975, he began working for

Basin Electric Power Cooperative in Stanton, N. D. and in 1978, transferred to the Laramie River Station in Wheatland as one of the first permanent employees. Tom retired in March, 1995 from Basin Electric Power Cooperative. He was a member of the United Methodist Church and his hobbies included golf, bowling and fishing.

Tom is survived by his wife, Myrna of Wheatland; two children, Pamela S. Opdahl of Casper, Wyo. and Robert R. Eastman of Berlin, Wisc.; four grandchildren, Kristy Opdahl, Douglas Opdahl and Kayla Opdahl of Casper, and Alexandra Eastman of Berlin; five brothers, John Eastman of Glasgow, Mont., Fred Eastman of Somers, Mont., Herb Eastman of Libbey, Mont., Emmery Eastman of Clinton, Ark. and Marion Eastman of Eureka, Mo.; five sisters, Monie Candee of Preston, Wash., Beatrice Rodman of Stayton, Ore., Adeline Garden of Vancouver, Wash., Geneva Kinniburgh of Kalispell, Mont. and Patricia Hartle of Sidney, Mont.
