

GEORGE, HENRY WILLIAM  
November 11, 1889-September 30, 1944

Death came to Henry William George, 55, in the Wheatland General Hospital early Saturday morning, September 30, as the result of injuries incurred when he was knocked beneath a run-away team at his farm near Slater Friday afternoon. He had returned from the field with a wagon load of feed when something startled the team, causing them to run away. Following the tragic accident, Mrs. George rushed two miles to a neighbor for help before he could be brought to the hospital for treatment.

Mr. George, son of W.D. and Flora A. George, was born in Mercer county, Mo., November 11, 1889. At the age of 21, he homesteaded in Platte county near Slater where he resided until his death. On February 14, 1917, he was united in marriage to Verna A. Brundage of Unionville, Mo., and to this union, three children were born, two preceding him in death.

He is survived by his wife; one son, Robert Lee serving with the armed forces somewhere in England; and two sisters, Mrs. Mabel Morgan of Alturas, Calif., and Mrs. Gertrude G. Lichty of St. Louis, Mo.

Funeral services were held in the Christian church with the Rev. Clifford Higby officiating on Tuesday, October 3. Mrs. Robert Kuns and Mr. Robert Barnes, accompanied by Mrs. J.E. Bohmont, sang. Pallbearers included Charles Campbell, Bert Ashenhurst, Dave Hankins, Bill McQuiety, B.A. Lewellyn and Brice McElvain. Interment was in the Wheatland cemetery. The Schrader Funeral home was in charge of arrangements.
