

David Lee Geringer

Funeral services for David Lee Geringer, 49, were held Saturday, Nov. 24, at 10 a.m. at the United Church of Christ in Wheatland with the Rev. James S. Vuocolo officiating. Interment followed in the Wheatland Cemetery.

Mr. Geringer died Monday, Nov. 19 at the Platte County Memorial Hospital in Wheatland of an apparent sudden heart attack.

Mr. Geringer was born Feb. 8, 1941 in Wheatland, the son of John and Bertha (Brunner) Geringer. He was reared and educated in Wheatland, graduating from Wheatland High School in 1958. He then worked with his father on the family farm northeast of Wheatland.

He was married to Betty Lou Blank on Dec. 9, 1961 in Wheatland at the United Church of Christ. He then worked on various ranches and farms in the area. In 1968, he moved to Glendo, and first worked for the Treckman Ranch, and when it was sold to Charles "Bud" Christensen in 1973, he continued to manage the ranch for Mr. Christensen until the time of his death.

He was currently serving on the Platte County Memorial Hospital Board, was a member of the American Angus Association and the Wyoming Angus Association. He served as a 4-H Leader for a time, and was also a member of the United Church of Christ. His life and enjoyment was working on the ranch.

He is survived by his wife, Betty of Glendo, his children, Brenda and Mike Burnett of Casper, Darin Geringer and Lance Geringer, both of Glendo, his mother, Bertha Geringer of Wheatland, his three sisters and five brothers and their spouses, Don and Barbara Geringer of Bloomfield, Colo., Louise and Bill Shepard, Kathy and Larry Lebsack and Fred and Jeri Geringer, all of Wheatland. Ed and Sandy Geringer of Gillette, Joe and Tammy Geringer, Leonard Geringer, and Cindy and Gregor Goertz, all of Wheatland. Also surviving are a sister-in-law, Glenzola Kempf of Denver, Colo., two grandchildren, Kristen and Sean Burnett of Casper, and numerous nieces and nephews.

He was preceded in death by his father, John Geringer, on Jan. 10, 1980.
