

GERVIC, MARTIN WILLIAM
April 19, 1894-November 16, 1965

Martin William Gersic, age 71, was found dead at his home in Wheatland on the evening of Dec. 5. Death was apparently caused by a sudden cerebral hemorrhage about November 16, 1965. The body was discovered by the local police after a telephone call by Mr. Gersic's family in Ft. Collins, Colo. The family requested that the police check his home after they had made several unsuccessful attempts to contact him.

Mr. Gersic was born in Austria, Hungary on April 19, 1894. He served as a corporal in the Marines in World War I from June 17 until February 19. He had been a resident of Wheatland since 1958, and was employed at the ASC office until his retirement. He was a member of the Catholic church.

Surviving relatives include two sons, Francis Gersic, U.S. Naval Base, Groton, Conn. and Joseph Gersic, Pueblo, Colo.; and two brothers and five sisters.

Father Leonard Wren conducted graveside services at the Wheatland cemetery on Dec. 9 at 11:00 a.m.
