

GRAHAM, RONALD LAVERNE  
August 31, 1946-January 7, 1968

Ronald LaVerne Graham, Slater, was killed instantly Sunday, January 7, when a freight train plowed into his stalled car at a railroad crossing. Graham was carried about 175 feet before being knocked clear. The main body of the car was carried one and one half miles by the train which was estimated to have been going in excess of 60 miles an hour when it hit the car.

Ronald Graham was born at Wheatland August 31, 1946 and had been a lifetime resident. He had only recently returned from serving in Vietnam, and had been employed at the Claude Lewis ranch for three months. He was affiliated with the Church of Latter Day Saints.

Surviving are his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Roy Graham; grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. C.R. Tanner, Los Angles, Calif.; a brother, Neil Graham, Vietnam; five sisters, Mrs. Fred Jensen, Vancouver, Wash., Mrs. Keith Jussel, Casper, Mrs. Reece Shoe, AFB, Chicopee, Mass., Mrs. Jack Hayes, Belford, N.J., and Mrs. Melvin Wright, Bosler.

Funeral services will be conducted by Bishop Neal Kelly and Bishop John Simons at the Schrader Funeral Home today (Thursday) at 2:00 p.m. Interment will be in the local cemetery.
