

GRANT, DUNCAN
1853-December 21, 1932

Duncan Grant, one of Wheatland's early day settlers, passed away at his ranch on the Sibylee, Wednesday morning after an illness that kept him bedfast for the past twenty years.

Funeral services will be held from the Masonic Temple Friday morning at 10 o'clock. Burial will be made in the Wheatland cemetery with the Copley Funeral Home in charge of arrangements. The pallbearers are composed of life-long friends and members of the Masonic order. They are: Osgood Johnson, E.M. Banks, D.W. Brice, H.T. Fish, George Richardson and H.W. Loomis.

Duncan Grant came to this section of Wyoming in 1874. In 1879, he worked for the Swan Land & Cattle Co. as round-up foreman. After two years in this position, he became manager of all their ranches. In 1899, he settled on the Sibylee and since that time has made his home there.

He is survived by his wife and five children, Mrs. Margaret Crouter of Denver, George, Ollie, Agnes and Dorothy, all of Wheatland.
