

**Mrs. Robert Grant,
Old Pioneer Passes
Away Last Thursday**

**She Settled Here With
Her Husband Fifty
Years Ago**

The community was shocked last Thursday when the news reached Wheatland of the death of Mrs. Robert Grant at her home on the Grant ranch on north Reishaw creek.

Mrs. Grant was one of the old settlers in this country having made her home here for 50 years. The passing of this pioneer brings back thots of her early privations and hardships when she helped to make this country what it is today and safe for her friends and loved ones.

She was of Scotch birth and had all of their wonderful characteristics, being God fearing, honest, and spent her life in making her home cheerful and raising her family to be honest and industrious citizens.

The funeral was held at the Congregational church, Sunday, at 2 o'clock and Rev. D. Powell rendered the funeral oration. It was attended by old settlers from all over this section, they having come to pay their last respects to one of their own kind, who in passing to her reward leaves her work well done and is entitled to a seat beside her maker. Burial was made in the Wheatland cemetery with the Watson Mortuary in charge.

OBITUARY

Mrs. Robert Grant was born in Tankerton, Scotland, on November 6th, 1844. She was married to Robert Grant in 1867 and came to the United States in 1878 and settled on the M-ranch on Chugwater creek, where the present town of Slater is now located. They took up a homestead near there, which they sold a few years later and located seven miles west of Slater, on the north Reishaw creek, where the present home ranch is located. Her husband, Robert Grant, passed away six years ago, on the 21st day of September, 1921. Altho they did not belong to any church locally, they were members of the United Presbyterian church of Scotland and were both earnest Christian workers and were regular attendants at church while they resided in Wheatland. To them seven children were born, four of whom are living to mourn her departure. Those who have passed on are Thomas Grant, William Grant and Sara Grant. Those who remain are Robert M. Grant, Duncan P. Grant, Harry Grant and Clara Chase. The family desires to express their thanks and appreciation to the friends for their acts of kindness and expression of sympathy in this time of bereavement.
