

GUENTHER, HARRY LOWES  
February 9, 1893-March 27, 1977

Funeral services for Harry L. Guenther were held Wednesday, March 30, at the United Church of Christ with the Rev. Gordon Tritchler officiating. Burial was in the Wheatland Cemetery. Guenther, 84, died Sunday, March 27, at his home in Wheatland after an extended illness.

He was born in Dayton, Ohio, February 9, 1893. He came west and lived in Torrington prior to entering the Army. He was involved in some of the major skirmishes while serving during World War I. After being discharged from the service, he returned to Torrington and began his career in meat cutting, where he later met and married Mary Reed. He owned and operated his own meat market in Lingle prior to joining the Safeway chain. He was employed by Safeway in Cheyenne, Casper and Rawlins prior to settling in Wheatland where he retired in 1953.

Guenther was a member of Masonic Lodge AF & AM #37 of Lingle, Wyo., Royal Arch, Royal Templar of Wheatland, and was a past patron of the Eastern Star of Wheatland. He was affiliated with the United Church of Christ in Wheatland.

He is survived by his wife Mary of Wheatland, and one brother, James Guenther of Phoenix, Arizona.

Serving as pallbearers were Charles Gorman, Dick Woodhouse, Herb Percy, Al Johnson, Denzil Blow, and Ted Thompson.

A memorial has been established to the United Church of Christ. Schrader-Prell Funeral Home was in charge of arrangements.
