

GUSTIN, JOHN JOSEPH
May 12, 1864-November 10, 1955

Funeral services were held for John Joseph Gustin, 91, a Wheatland resident since 1934, at the Schrader chapel last Saturday, November 12, at 2 p.m. with the Rev. J.B. Milstead in charge of the rites. Burial was in the Wheatland cemetery. Pallbearers were M.R. Foe, Myriel Jordan, Clark Haeberle, James Dunham, Harry Dearing and Glen Nixson.

Mr. Gustin, son of Francis C. and Magdalena Gustin, was born at Silver Creek, Wisc., May 12, 1864, and passed away at a local hospital November 10 following a long illness. He was in the hospital five days preceding his death. He was a retired farmer and stock feeder, and followed the mercantile and plumbing trade for some years after moving to Wheatland.

At the age of sixteen, he moved from Wisconsin to Plattsmouth, Nebr. On October 20, 1887, he was united in marriage to Myrtle Gilmore. They moved to Wheatland in 1934. His wife preceded him in death March 19, 1943.

Left to mourn his passing are two daughters, Mrs. Marguerite Allspach and Mrs. Mark (Grace) Havelly, both of Wheatland; a son, Joseph F. Gustin of Murdock, Nebr.; one brother, Ed N. Gustin of Lincoln, Nebr.; four grandchildren and five great grandchildren.
