## Vertis Horton Dies From Heart Attack

Funeral services for Vertis Quinten Horton, well known Platte county businessman and rancher, were held Thurs., Feb. 26 at 2 p.m. in the Methodist Church here.

Mr. Horton, 50, died in the Platte County Memorial hospital Monday following a heart attack suffered two weeks ago. He was born Feb. 9, 1920 in Peabody, Kans., but had been a life-long resident of Goshen and Platte counties.

He was reared on his parents' ranch in the Bear Creek community in Goshen county, and attended the University of Wyoming and Barnes Business College in Denver. On January 5, 1941, he married the former Waverly Storm of Chugwater. They have four married chil-

dren.

Mr. and Mrs. Horton farmed and ranched in Platte and Goshen counties for 20 years before moving to Chugwater, where they operated a Standard service station and bulk plant. Two years ago, they moved to Wheatland where they have been engaged in the same type of business.

The deceased was stricken while at work on Feb. 10, the

day after his 50th birthday.
