

JACKSON, EDWARD  
February 8, 1864-December 24, 1939

The body of Edward Jackson, 76, who lived alone near the Goshen Hole district 25 miles southeast of Wheatland, was found frozen in his cabin on Tuesday of this week by a neighbor, Mrs. George Richardson.

County Coroner, C. Stewart Dennis who investigated the death after being notified by Mrs. Richardson stated it is not known how long Mr. Jackson had been dead, but it is thought he passed away some time before Christmas. Letters in the mailbox were postmarked December 26. Mr. Dennis stated that death was apparently caused by sudden cerebral hemorrhage, as the deceased was found lying across his bed.

Mrs. Richardson went to see the aged settler after receiving a letter from his son. Al William Jackson of Chicago, Illinois, who had not heard from his father for several weeks. He was informed of the tragedy in a telephone conversation with Mr. Dennis.

The body was brought to Wheatland in the Watson and Dennis ambulance and last rites were conducted Wednesday afternoon with Rev. C.B. Doughty officiating. Interment was made in the local cemetery.
