JACKSON, FRANCIS JANE WOOD February 15, 1852-November 28, 1927

Mrs. Francis Jane (Wood) Jackson was born February 15th, 1852, near Richmond, Va., and departed this life from her late home in Wheatland, Wyoming, Monday, November 28th, 1927 being at the time of her death 75 years, 9 months and 13 days of age.

In early childhood she moved westward with her parents and settled at Cambridge, Mo., where she resided until she reached her maturity. On May 14th, 1871, she was united in marriage to Benjamin Franklin Jackson in Cambridge, Mo., and to this union eight children were given.

At the age of nineteen she surrendered her life to her Master and followed him in Baptism and united with the Baptist church and has lived a close and consistent life for her Lord all these years, thus serving Him for the last 56 years.

She has held membership in the Fish Creek, Oak Grove and Sweet Springs churches in various parts of Missouri and in the First Church in Hunter, Oklahoma. Her membership being in the latter at the time of her death.

On April 5, 1888, her home was visited by the death angel, when her beloved companion was called to the Heights above leaving his widow and seven children behind. She was also preceded in death by two sons-Walter James who died at the age of three and William Henry whose death occurred in his home in Sophia, Okla. in 1915.

Jackson of Wheatland, Wyo., Peter Sterling Jackson of Corder, Mo., Charles Franklin Jackson and Mrs. I.O. Banks of Higginsville, Mo.; two brothers, Wm. J. Wood of Imperial Valley, Calif. and the Rev. Geo. E. Wood of Mt. Vernon, Ind., 41 grandchildren, 19 great grandchildren and a host of friends and other relatives.

The funeral will be held at 2 o'clock today, Thursday, from the Baptist church, the Rev. Charles F. Thomas officiating. Burial will be in the Wheatland cemetery. The Watson Mortuary is in charge of the arrangements.
