

JACKSON, LULA BELLE REID  
October 15, 1880-September 27, 1964

Funeral services were held Wednesday, Sept. 30, 1964 for Mrs. Lula Belle Jackson, 83, at 1:30 p.m. at the Schrader chapel, with Rev. Ralph Martin of the First Baptist church in charge. She succumbed Sunday, Sept. 27, at the Memorial hospital after a long illness. Interment was in the Wheatland cemetery.

Mrs. Jackson was born in Robertson County, Tennessee, October 15, 1880 to Mr. and Mrs. John Scott Reid. She was united in marriage to Luther Graves, and to this union, a son, Arthel Odell Graves was born. On September 3, 1919, she married Benjamin N. Jackson and came to Wyoming to make her home. Mr. and Mrs. Jackson homesteaded on the North Laramie, and resided there for several years before moving to Wheatland to make their home. Mr. Jackson, with the assistance of Mrs. Jackson, served for many years as custodian of the Wheatland grade school. Mrs. Jackson was affiliated with the First Baptist church.

The deceased husband preceded her in death April 27, 1957. Survivors, besides her son, Arthel O. Graves of Lebanon, Tenn., include six grandchildren: Mrs. Gary Graves, Mrs. John F.
