

JACKSON, NORMAN DRIGGS
August 18, 1866-September 7, 1944

Funeral services were held at 12:15 p.m. Sunday in the Methodist church for N.D. Jackson, 78, who died in the Wheatland hospital Thursday, September 7, from injuries incurred when he fell from the roof of his home the previous day, from mending the roof. The Rev. W.W. Maxwell, assisted by Mr. Clarke Devore, officiated and Mr. and Mrs. Ben Cossman, Lowell Clark and daughter, Eileen, sang, accompanied by Mrs. J.E. Bohmont.

Norman Driggs Jackson was born August 18, 1866 near Pittsburg, Penn., the second son of Mr. and Mrs. Robert F. Jackson. At the age of four, he moved with his parents to a farm near Toledo, Ia. On March 6, 1890, he was united in marriage to Miss Maria Wade of Toledo, and they celebrated their 54th wedding anniversary last March. He had been a resident of this community since 1909 when he and his wife and daughter, Lucille moved to Wheatland to make their home on a farm west of town. Mr. Jackson was affiliated with the Methodist church.

Besides his wife, he is survived by a daughter, Mrs. S.R. Mills; a brother, Prof. George B. Jackson of Seattle, Wash.; a sister, Mrs. Frank Millard of Toledo, Ia.; four grandchildren, Mrs. Vernon Cook of San Jose, Calif., Harry J. Mills, S 1/c, Marvin Mills of Wheatland, Mrs. Marion Burden of Esterbrook; and four great grandchildren.
