

JENKINS, NOBLE EDWIN
January 19, 1881-June 20, 1960

Noble Edwin Jenkins, aged 74, died at a local hospital, June 20, after an extended illness. He was a retired railroader, having worked as a telegraph operator and ticket agent for various companies for 50 years, 32 years for the Union Pacific. He spent twenty years in Laramie in that capacity and 12 years in Yoder. Mr. Jenkins retired two years ago, and has since been a resident of the Irvine Home.

Survivors are his wife, Mabel E. Jenkins and a daughter, Mrs. Charles Wille, both of Mt. View, Alaska; sister, Mrs. Arthur Rugg of Wheatland; a brother, Charles A. Jenkins of Leominster, Mass.; and two grandchildren.

He was born in Kearney, Nebr., January 19, 1881, the son of James and Mary E. Morrison Jenkins. He was a member of the Methodist church and the AF & AM of Kearney.

Funeral services are scheduled for Friday at the Schrader Chapel, the Rev. J.B. Milstead officiating and Masonic rites at the graveside in the Wheatland cemetery, with AF & AM No. 16 in charge.
