George Pauli is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Philip Pauli, who came here quite recognity, buying the old Bovee farm some six miles weet of town Mrs. miles west of town. Mr. and Mrs. Kling had a son killed by a train a few years ago. The American Legion was sponsoring this bout and they are paying all funeral expenses. The funeral was held from the Methodist church on Tuesday afternoon, and burial was made in the Wheatland cemetery with arrangements in charge of the Watson Mortuary. It has been a very hard blow to the two families though no blame attaches to George Pauli in the matter.
