LARSON, FREDERICK ALBERT May 24, 1867-May 30, 1953

Frederick Albert Larson, 86, who farmed in the Antelope Gap country for more than twenty years, died in the local hospital last Saturday, May 30, following an illness of two months' duration. Services were held on Tuesday of this week at the Schrader Funeral home at two p.m. with the Rev. J.B. Milstead officiating at the rites.

Mr. Larson had made his home in Englewood, Colo. the past nine years with a daughter, Mrs. Lottie Hitch. Previous to that time he had lived on his wheat farm east of Wheatland for over 20 years. He was born in Falkoping, Sweden on May 24, 1867, and after coming to this country, followed the farming and contractor business from which he retired several years ago.

The deceased, as a contractor, built the Hynds building in Cheyenne, as well as many of the barracks at Ft. Warren, the IOOF hall in Cheyenne and numerous other structures in the capital city.

His survivors include two daughters, Mrs. Lottie Hitch and Mrs. Earl Harvey of Slater; two sons, Elmer Larson of Yucaipa, Calif. and Wallace Larson of Cheyenne; nine grandchildren and eleven great grandchildren.

Mr. Larson's grandsons were casket bearers. Interment took place in the Wheatland cemetery.
