

LEETE, CHARLES NELSON  
1908-June 6, 1936

Nine months of suffering was ended today for Charles Leete, 28, who succumbed this morning in the Ivinson hospital to injuries incurred last September 5 in an automobile accident.

Funeral services will be held in Wheatland, Mr. Leete's former home. Arrangements are being made by the Shannon funeral chapel.

Mr. Leete, an automobile mechanic employed here last fall by the Vic White garage, suffered a broken back when a light roadster in which he was riding overturned at the corner of Grand avenue and 14<sup>th</sup> street.

The machine was driven by R.J. (Dick) Davis. The car apparently attempted to turn north on 14<sup>th</sup> street from a westerly course on Grand avenue, and failed to negotiate the curve, it swung far to the left, overturned at the curb and came to a stop against a tree on the lawn of the Will Goodale residence.

Leete was taken to the Ivinson hospital, where his condition was pronounced too grave to attempt an operation. He was given medical treatment continuously since the mishap.--Laramie Republic-Boomerang.

Carley Leete was well known in Wheatland which was his home prior to going to Laramie. He had worked at the sugar factory and for a while on a ranch near Cassa.

He is survived by his wife, Vivian, and little five year old daughter, Charlotte, and his mother who lives in California, but was unable to attend the funeral which was held at 2:30 Tuesday afternoon from the Lyla Watson Funeral Home, Rev. L.W. Flenner officiating. Interment was made in the Wheatland cemetery.
