Harold Francis LeMaster, 58, died Thursday, Nov. 27 in

Wheatland.

He was born in Kentucky Dec. 31, 1921, the son of Proctor and Bertha LeMaster. He was raised and educated in Kentucky and left there to enter the U.S. Army during World War II. He was discharged from active duty in Spokane, Wash. While there he met and married Vicki Middleton.
