

## MISS JULIA LEWIS DIES

Death again invaded the Lewis family and removed from its circle a dearly loved member in the person of Miss Julia S. Lewis, on January 13th, following a brief illness at the home of her neice, Mrs. Wilma Thompson.

Miss Lewis was in her seventy-seventh year. She was born in Ohio, the second daughter of Elder Russell E. Lewis and Mrs. Lewis. Miss Lewis and her elder sisiter, Miss Lodema Lewis, made their home together for many years until death claimed Miss Lodema some years ago. Miss Lewis is a sisiter of the late Mrs. J. T. Duffy, and the aunt of Harold, Glenn, and Roland Duffy and Mrs. Wilma Thompson of Wheatland, and of Mr. Lewis of Fishcreek and Gale Lawis, former treasurer of Platte county and now a resident of California, and of Mrs. H. T. English, also of California.

Miss Lewis was a bright-cheery woman with a kindly word and thought for everyone, but paramount of all was her love for every root and branch of her family. She had resided in Dwyer for many years and has hosts of friends there who will join those of Wheatland in sympathy to the bereaved family and friends.

The funeral was held on Wednesday afternoon from the Watson Mortuary, at two o'clock, with Rev. Orman King in charge and burial was beside her sister Lodema in the Wheatland cemetery.

Miss Lewis was visiting with Mrs. Thompson at the time of her death. She had been a faithful and consistent Christian all her life, having been brought up in the home of Christian parents and surrounded by the best influences.

Funeral esrvices were held at the Watson Mortuary Wednesday afternoon and interment was in the Wheatland cemetery. The sermon was delivered by Rev. O. C. King, pastor of the Methodist church of which the deceased was a member. He was assisted in the services by Rev. Marion Morris, pastor of the Christian church at Dwyer.
