Services for Walter Jackson Lisher, 69, who died in Wheatland Feb. 4 were held Feb. 8, in St. Patrick Catholic Church with Father John Murray officiating. Rosary services were Tuesday evening at the church.

Walter Lisher was born March 16, 1914, in Wayne, Kan., the son of Lewis and Lucy Lisher. His mother died when he was two and a half years old and he lived with relatives.

He settled in Oregon and worked as a carpenter for various construction companies. While at his last construction job in a chemical plant he developed an illness which necessitated his retirement.

He traveled extensively for a period of time before returning to Kansas. He moved to Wheatland in May of 1967 and spent his retirement years here. He and Mary Agnes Erschabek were married in May of 1967.
