

LIVINGSTON, IDA ESTELLE SLATER

March 18, 1870-February 23, 1929

The many friends and relatives of Mrs. J.R. Livingston were shocked and grieved to learn of her sudden death Saturday, February 23rd at her home in the west part of town. Mrs. Livingston had been ill for some time with influenza, but at the time of her death she was seemingly better. On Saturday morning she was stricken with paralysis and before medical death could reach her, she became unconscious. Later in the day, she passed away.

Ida Estelle Slater was born at Clarksburg, W. Va., March 18, 1870. She was married to J.R. Livingston on March 1, 1892 at Cambridge, Nebr. They lived in Nebraska until 1901 when they went to Washington state and came back to Nebraska in 1904, and in the spring of 1923, they moved to Wheatland, Wyo. One daughter died in infancy and she is survived by her husband J.R. Livingston, two daughters, Mrs. Richard Butner of the Cottonwood community and Mrs. C.L. Davis of the Bordeaux district; one sister, Miss Cora Slater of Slater; two brothers, W.E. Slater of Denver, Colo., and L.W. Slater of Slater, and five grandchildren. She joined the church in her girlhood and at the time of her death she was a member of the Methodist church at Wheatland.

Funeral services were held from the Wheatland Methodist church Tuesday afternoon, with Rev. Orman C. King preaching the funeral oration and interment was made in the Wheatland cemetery with the Watson Mortuary in charge of arrangements.
