Mrs. Mary Locke

Mrs. Mary Locke died at her home in the west part of Wheatland on Wednesday night of last week. Mrs. Locke was in her sixty-second year. Her death was very sudden, following a stroke of paralysis at about three o'clock and she died about an hour later. She was the widow of Nathan Locke, a veteran of the Civil War, who died in 1908, while the family was living on their homestead on Luman creek.

Mary Ann Fike was born in Waterloo, Iowa, in 1869. She was married to Nathan T. Locke in 1885, coming to Wyoming in 1903. To them were born 13 children, all but two of whom are living, being John W., Charles F., Clarence B., Nathan E., Dyson J., Mrs. Eldora Olson, Mrs. Jessie Krietz, Mrs. Ruby Menter, all of Wheatland, Wyoming, Mrs. Anna VanOrtwick and Mrs. Etta Kraal, of Medford, Oregon, and Aaron Locke of Temple, Calif.

Funeral services were held from the Congregational church on Friday afternoon, with Rev. R. E. Morgan in charge. Burial was in the Wheatland cemetery with the Longwith-Richards Funeral Home in charge of arrangements. Quantities of beautiful flowers testified to the love and respect of her many friends.
