

LOFING, MARY STROMAN
November 12, 1902-August 25, 1979

Mary Lofing, long-time Wheatland area resident, passed away Saturday, Aug. 25, 1979, at the Platte County Memorial Hospital in Wheatland at the age of 76.

Mary Stroman was born Nov. 12, 1902 in Dittle, Russia. At the age of six, she moved to the United States with her family settling in Windsor, Colo. She was raised and educated in the Windsor area, and met and married Henry Lofing there in 1920.

She and her husband and children moved to the Wheatland area in 1929 and operated a farm here until they moved to Sheridan and Dayton for a period of about 10 years.

They then returned to Wheatland where they farmed until 1969 at which time they retired and moved into town. Her husband, Henry, passed away in 1976.

She is survived by two sons, Adam Lofing of Joes, Colo., and Robert Lofing of Kingsburg, Calif.; one daughter, Mrs. Kenneth (Dorothy) Hanks of Wheatland; eleven grandchildren; eight great grandchildren, seven sisters and two brothers.

She was preceded in death by her husband, Henry, one son, Raymond, one sister and her parents.

Funeral services were conducted Tuesday, Aug. 28, 1979, at the Trinity Lutheran Church in Wheatland with the Rev. Emmett Rogness officiating and interment was in the Wheatland Cemetery.
