ly on Friday, July 10, 1970, of a wound in the chest from a 12gauge shotgun. Harry L. Lonquest, her husband, has been charged with first degree murder in the fatal shooting.

Lonquest called the La Ramie Hotel after the shooting and Pauline Van Dyke notified Sheriff Mickelsen. When the authorities arrived at the Lonquest ranch 15 miles northeast of Wheatland Longuest was waiting for them. It was determined Mrs. Longuest had died some time between 10,00 a.m. and noon.

A coroner's inquest was held on Monday, July 13 at 8:00 a.m. in the Schrader Mortuary. The coroner's jury, consisted of Mark Boughn, Sam White, and Ronald Williams. Testifying Ronald Williams. Testifying were Pauline Van Dyke, Dr. James G. Allison, and Sheriff Mickelsen. The verdict was that the deceased came to her death apparently by the hand of Harry Lonquest.

Longuest was then turned over to the custody of Sheriff

Mickelsen and charged with first degree murder.

Private funeral services were held on Tuesday, July 14, at 10:00 a.m. at the graveside, with Father Leonard Wren officiating. Interment was in the Wheatland cemetery at the family plot.
