

LOOMIS, MARGARET ISABELL McLOUGHLIN

1866-October 1, 1930.

Mrs. H.W. Loomis, widely known long time resident of Platte County, died at a hospital in Denver about noon Wednesday.

With her when death called were her husband and all the children, who had been in the Colorado city for several days hoping for an improvement in her condition.

The Times learned by telephone this morning that Mr. Loomis and the family will return to Wheatland this evening, Thursday, and the remains will arrive by train for burial in the local cemetery. The time of burial has not been definitely determined at 9:50 o'clock this morning.

Margaret Isabell McLoughlin was born in Priceville, Ontario, Canada and came to Wyoming at an early age with her parents. They settled on a ranch on Horse Creek and later moved to Cheyenne to make their home.

She was one of the pioneer school teachers of Laramie county during the nineties.

The deceased was united in marriage to H.W. Loomis in 1898 and is survived by her husband; three sons, William, Harold and Ernest, and one daughter, Margaret, all of Wheatland; one sister, Mrs. George VanZandt of Cheyenne and one brother, Colin McLoughlin of Harding, Mont.
