

LOOMIS, MAYBELLE H. DAMM  
September 10, 1886-January 13, 1956

Mrs. MayBelle Loomis, one of Wheatland's best loved residents, passed away in Kansas City, Mo., last Friday, January 13, following ten days' hospitalization. Mrs. Loomis left Wheatland just before Christmas to spend the holidays and several weeks with a sister in Sedalia and with other relatives there and at Kansas City. She became ill en route to Missouri, and never recovered after reaching her destination.

Mrs. Loomis and her late husband, Fred, came to Platte county from Missouri in 1919. For some years they ranched on Cottonwood, and then moved to Wheatland. Mr. Loomis passed away a little more than two months ago.

An active and hard-working member in several organizations, Mrs. Loomis was also beloved for her many kind and neighborly deeds, and numbered among her legion of friends young and old alike. She was a member of the Congregational church, the Rebekah lodge, American Legion auxiliary and the Cottonwood Country Women's club.

Born at Cole Camp, Mo., September 10, 1886, Mrs. Loomis was 69 years of age at the time of her death. Left to mourn her passing are three sisters, Mrs. Bea George, Hermosa Beach, Calif.; Mrs. Maude Crouch, Sedalia, Mol, and Mrs. T. B. Brown, Kansas City, Mo.; three brothers, Carl Damm, Sedalia, Mo., Norman Damm, Kansas City, Kans.; and Anson Damm, Rich Hill, Mo.

Funeral services were held Tuesday afternoon of this week at 2 p.m., in the Congregation church, with the Rev. Alan Inglis and Rev. Alfred Coolidge, in charge. Interment was in the Wheatland cemetery with final rites being conducted by the Rebekah lodge at the graveside.
