Services for Deuane Olen Lowry, 63, who died in McAllen, Texas, May 3, 1986, were held in the United Methodist Church in Wheatland May 7, 1986 at 10:30 A.M. with Pastors Virgil Lamm and Delbert Dick officiating.

Deuane Lowry was born Dec. 27, 1922 in Weatherford, Okla. the son of Sherman and Lucy Lowry. He grew up in a small town, Putnam, Okla., where he attended and graduated from

high school.

tion of the old Slater School.

He will be best remembered for his many good qualities in life as a leader and a helper to many friends, for his sense of humor, his honesty, his pride and quality of work, his positive outlook and

zest for life, and as a hard worker.

On August 23, 1942, Deuane and Roberta Jane Wilmeth were married. They had two children, David Lowry of Broken Arrow, Okla. and Betsy Jefferson of Wheatland. They also enjoyed five grandchildren: Whitney Jefferson, Jennifer Lowry, A.J. Jefferson, Sara Jefferson and Jessica Lowry. Deuane is survived by his sister, Cleo Green and brother, Clell Lowry, both of Taloga, Okla.

He was preceded in death by his parents.
