

LUCY, ALVINA D. GLUESING
March 29, 1890-February 13, 1978

Funeral services were held Thursday, February 16, for Alvina D. Lucy at the United Church of Christ with Reverend Delbert Dick officiating. Interment was at the Wheatland Cemetery.

Mrs. Lucy passed away at the age of 87 at Bethesda Care Center in Laramie. She was born in Gilmanton, Wisconsin March 29, 1890.

Alvina came to the Wheatland area to teach school in 1919 at the Lloyds School on the Laramie River North of Laramie. After one year here, she went back to Wisconsin to teach for one year. She then came back to the Wheatland area and taught at the Sybille Country school for four years. Alvina then moved to Hanna to teach and while there she married George Lucy in Rawlins on October 10, 1925.

The couple lived in Hanna for about one year and then moved back to the Wheatland area and settled on the Bridger Ranch in 1926. They lived on the ranch until 1963 when they retired and moved into Wheatland to make their home.

In death she is survived by her husband, George Lucy and one son, George Jr. of Wheatland; three brothers, Ben Gluesing of Wisconsin, Bill Gluesing of Florida, and Ed Gluesing of Illinois; two sisters, Kate Wolford of Washington and Jeanette Bernard of Laramie.

One son, David; two brothers, John and Henry and two sisters, Minnie and Alice preceded her in death.
