

NAFFZIGER, ANNA NEIDRICH

October 18, 1844-May 1923

The funeral of Mrs. John A. Naffziger occurred here Saturday afternoon from the residence of W.B. Longwith, Rev. E.L. Butler being in charge of the services.

The remains arrived here Thursday from Los Angeles, Calif., in charge of Mr. and Mrs. Eugene Elder, the former being a grandson of the deceased. Other arrivals here for the funeral was her daughter, Mrs. E.K. McDonald, and son of Ault, Colo., and her son, S.A. Naffziger of Otoe, Nebr.

Mrs. J.A. Naffziger, nee Anna Neidrich, was born Oct. 6<sup>th</sup>, 1844, at Nancy, France. When she reached the age of 11 years, the family emigrated to the United States, landing here on Dec. 18<sup>th</sup>, 1855, after a six months voyage from Havre.

She was married on Sept. 27<sup>th</sup>, 1866 to John A. Naffziger. Four children were born to this union, Joseph D. Naffziger who died here in 1921, Mrs. E.K. McDonald of Ault, Colo., Mrs. J.E. Elder of Los Angeles, Calif., and S.A. Naffziger of Otoe, Nebr. One sister, Mrs. Mary Heimer of Melvin, Kans., also survives. Her husband died at Wheatland Oct. 11, 1918 and was interred in the local cemetery. The deceased died after a short illness at the home of her daughter, Mrs. S.J. Elder of Los Angeles, where she had gone for a visit. She had long been a true Christian and a member of the Presbyterian church. She resided in Wheatland during 1914, coming here with her husband from Eaton, Colo., and afterwards resided for several years on the Naffziger ranch west of Wheatland. She had many friends who extend their sympathy to the bereaved.
