

Boy Fatally Injured When Struck By Car On Sunday

James Noe, 16 year old son of John Noe, Wheatland flats farmer, living southwest of town died Sunday evening in the Wheatland hospital from injuries received when he was struck by a car driven by Andrew Winter of Guernsey at 3:40 Sunday afternoon.

James was with friends when they stopped their car on the side of the road to allow him to cross the road so that he could come to town with Barton Sherwood. As he stepped out of the car he ran in front of the Winter machine which struck him.

According to the Sheriffs office the Winter car was traveling only at a moderate rate of speed but when Noe's stepped in front of their car it was too sudden for them to stop.

Young Noe, suffering from two broken legs, fractured skull and internal injuries was taken to the Wheatland hospital where he died without regaining consciousness.

James is survived by his parents, two brothers and three sisters. He was the third child and was a freshman at Wheatland high school.

Watson and Dennis are in charge of funeral arrangements. The time has not yet been announced.

When the accident occurred the Winters were taking their son Andrew, Robert Crawford, and Elmer Green, all of Guernsey, to Laramie after spending the Easter vacation at home.

Noe's death is the first due to highway accidents this year in Platte county.
