

PALMER, LUCYANNA THOMPSON
October 10, 1840-September 26, 1931

Mrs. A.J. Palmer, long time resident of Platte county, died at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Nettie Moffatt in Los Angeles, Calif., Sunday, lacking 13 days of attaining 91 years.

Mrs. Palmer was born in Mobile, Ill., Oct. 10, 1840, the second child of Wm. and Mary Thompson. The Thompsons left Illinois in 1842 and settled in Richland, Wis., and in 1857, the family moved to Marshall county, Kansas and settled on the land on which the town of Blue Rapids now stands. They resided in Kansas for 33 years. From there they moved to Nebraska to reside four years, and in September, 1896 came to Wheatland and settled on the place now owned by Wm. Sutton on the Mule Shoe road.

Mrs. Palmer is survived by four children: W.A. Palmer of Palmer canyon, west of Wheatland; Mrs. Mary E. Thompson of Greeley, Colo., Mrs. Nettie Moffatt of Los Angeles, and Mrs. Lulu Southworth of Wheatland, Calif. Her husband preceded her in death in 1916. She is also survived by 21 grandchildren and seven great grandchildren.

Word was received in Wheatland this morning that the body would reach here on this evening's train. Arrangements have been made to hold the funeral at the Christian church Friday morning at 10 o'clock, Cecil V. Smith of that church, to preach the sermon. Burial will take place in the local cemetery. The Longwith-Richards Funeral Home will be in charge of the services here.
