

POLING, HENRY RICHARD
May 5, 1930-December 6, 1977

Services for Henry Richard Poling, 47, 1550 Mason, who died December 6, 1977 at the Platte County Memorial Hospital, were held at 2:00 p.m. Thursday, December 8, at the Church of the Nazarene in Wheatland with the Rev. Victor Berg officiating. Burial was in the Wheatland Cemetery.

He was born May 5, 1930 in Burwell, Neb., and lived there until he moved to the Wheatland area 18 years ago. During the time he lived in Wheatland, he was employed in the trucking and road construction fields until 1970 when he opened his own animal rendering service which he operated until the time of his death.

Poling was married to the former Faye Dewey, who survives. He was a life-time member of the Disabled American Veterans, Squaw Mountain Chapter No. 7 and a veteran of the Korean and Viet Nam conflicts. As a member of the DAV, he served as commander of the post for three years, and was also in the Veterans of Foreign Wars and the Wyoming National Guard where he recently received his 15 year pin.

Other survivors include two sons, James Richard and William Henry Poling of Wheatland; two daughters, Diana Lynn and Sherry June of Wheatland; two step-sons, Steve and Albert McCarty; and one brother, William Flavell of Omaha, Neb.; two sisters, Helen Brewer and Norma Freeman of Nebraska; and five grandchildren.

Pallbearers for the service were Henry McElhaney, Ed Greenwood, John Geringer, Roy Bowdish, Bruce Good and Karl Nickel.

A memorial has been established to the Church of the Nazarene in Wheatland. Funeral arrangements were made by the Schrader-Prell Funeral Home.
