

Services for Thelma Marguerite Potter, 62, of Lingle, who died Saturday in the Scottsbluff, Nebr. Hospital, were held Tuesday, March 28, 1983, in the Assembly of God Church at Wheatland, with Pastor Bob Little officiating.

Thelma Kissel Potter was born May 11, 1920 in Dawes County, Nebr., the daughter of John and Elsie Goolsby Kissel. She moved with her family to Guernsey as a child and then to Wheatland.

After graduating from Wheatland High School she attended cosmetology school in Cheyenne. She worked in a beauty shop in Torrington for a short while, then returned to Wheatland as owner-operator of Thelma's Beauty Shop.

In November of 1949, she married R. L. (Warpy) Potter. Their home was in Wheatland until 1968 when they moved to Lingle.
