

ROSENTRETER, JULIA L. WHITE

November 4, 1876-October 4, 1902

The community was greatly shocked Saturday last, to learn of the death of Mrs. G.W. Rosentreter, who passed away at the family home on the Sybille, near Grant. The deceased was taken sick only Tuesday evening before her death of appendicitis, and while at first, no grave apprehensions were entertained, it was soon discovered that the case was a very serious one. Friday, Dr. Johnston, of Cheyenne, was summoned, and assisted by Dr. Croskery, of this place, performed an operation, but the disease was so far progressed that there was no possible means of saving the patient, and death came shortly after the operation had been performed.

The deceased was held in highest esteem by all acquaintances, and her death is sincerely mourned by a large circle of personal friends. She leaves, besides the sorrowing husband, a little daughter four years of age, an aged father eighty-four years old, and a brother and three sisters. The home that has been so deeply plunged in sorrow, was a particularly happy one, Mr. and Mrs. Rosentreter being greatly devoted to each other, and as they had by thrift and industry succeeded in gaining a comfortable competence, it seems doubly sad that the death of the wife and mother should occur at this time, just when the future held out such a radiant bow of promise.

Brief services were held at the home Monday morning, conducted by Rev. Crater, and interment was made in the Wheatland cemetery. The funeral sermon will be preached at the home on Sunday, November 5th, at 10:00 o'clock a.m.

The deepest sympathy of the entire community goes out to the sorrowing husband and relatives.
