

Final Rites For K. C. Rugg, Mon.

Funeral services were held Monday at 2:00 p.m. from the Congregational church for Kenneth C. Rugg of Bloomington, Indiana, 48 year old associate professor of audio-visual education at Indiana University. He was the son of Mr. and Mrs. Arthur Rugg of Wheatland. Interment was in the Wheatland cemetery and pallbearers were Larry Birleffi, Glen Rogers, Duke DeForest, Cheyenne, Al Kenney, R. McWhinnie, Laramie and L. Belt.

At the time of his death, Professor Rugg had been serving as associate director of the Indiana University Audio-Visual Center, a position he had held since 1955.

Born June 8, 1911 in Cheyenne, he was a graduate of Wheatland high school and held the B.A. and M.A. degrees from the University of Wyoming. After graduate study at the University of California, at Berkley, and at Indiana University, he received the Ed.D. degree in 1954 at Indiana.



Before going to Indiana University as a graduate student in 1947, he had served as alumni secretary at the University of Wyoming; as grade school principal and high school coach at Saratoga; high school principal at Superior and superintendent of schools at Midwest.

A veteran of World War II as a line aviation officer in the U. S. Navy, he was a Lt. Commander in the Naval Reserve Electronics Battalion, Bloomington.

Professor Rugg, a member of the Board of Directors of the National University Extension Association, was president of the association's Division of Audio-Visual Instruction. He was a member of Phi Delta Kappa, education honorary, Sigma Nu fraternity, the Blue Lodge of Masonic Order, Saratoga and the American Legion.
