
## Dale E. Tatman

January 27, 1923 - February 28, 2015

A celebration of the life of for Dale E. Tatman, 92, will be at 10 a.m. Saturday, March 7 at the First Christian Church in Wheatland, with Pastor Andy Gudhal officiating. Interment will be in the Wheatland Cemetery with military honors accorded by Laramie Peak VFW Post #3358, Ora Call American Legion Post #10 and Wyoming Army National Guard Honor Guard.



Dale passed away Saturday, February 28 at the Platte County Memorial Hospital in Wheatland.

He was born to Ernest and Alice (Dixon) Tatman in Griggs, Oklahoma on January 27, 1923.

Dale and his wife, Ann, resided at Country

Club Living in Wheatland.

He met and married his "Georgia Peach" (Billie Ann Greer) from Tucker, Ga. on Oct. 11, 1947 and they have celebrated 67 happy years

together.

Dale and Ann have been members of the First Christian Church, where Dale has served as an elder and on the men's fellowship committee. He served on both the Wheatland (District 5) and Rock River School Boards as well as being a member of both the Veterans Foreign Wars and International Order of Old Fellows Lodge. He served in the United States Navy for a short time at the end of World War II and was honorably discharged in 1945.

Dale grew up on the family farm in the Oklahoma panhandle during the dust bowl years. He farmed with his brothers until they lost the farm to foreclosure and moved to Colorado. Dale moved his family to a ranch on the North Lara-

mie River north of Wheatland in 1950 where they lived for 11 years before moving to a ranch northeast of Rock River. After 20 years at Rock River, they moved back to their "home" in Wheatland.

Dale always enjoyed harvesting hay with one of the first Drube stackers made, hunting prairie dogs and jackrabbits, guiding deer and antelope hunters, fishing, playing pinochle, dominoes, and 42.

Dale's greatest ambition was to

find a good wife, a good ranch and to raise a family to be proud of and he has seen those dreams come true. All four children know the Lord and have been baptized, having selected

spouses he is proud of.

He is survived by his wife, Ann, daughters, Linda (Norman) Musselman of Cheyenne, Dianne (Dan) Shumway of Powell, Elaine (Darrel) Curry of Wheatland; son, Wayne (Kathy) Tatman of Lingle; 11 grandchildren; and 14 great grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by both his parents; sisters, Florence Johnson, Esther Cole; and

brothers, Ben and Earl.
