

Mrs. Weber Killed In One-Car Accident Sat.

Mrs. Jacqueline Barton Weber, Slater, was killed in a one car rollover Saturday night on U. S. 28 about three miles west of Guernsey. A passenger, Kenneth S. Peterson, thirty, of Wheatland, suffered minor cuts and bruises. The patrol said the victim was thrown out of the vehicle when it overturned.

Mrs. Weber's death raised the 1970 state traffic death toll to 31, which is 12 more than on the same date in 1969.

Funeral services for Mrs. Weber, 48, formerly of Cheyenne, will be held at 11 a.m. Thursday in Wiederspahn Chapel of the Chimes in Cheyenne with Rev. Robert Walkley officiating. Graveside rites will be conducted at 2 p.m. at the Wheatland cemetery.

Mrs. Weber had been in the ranching business for many years. She was born at Douglas and lived in Cheyenne for many years before moving to Slater.

She was a member of the Presbyterian church, American Legion and VFW Auxiliaries, the Slater Farm Bureau and the Bordeaux Ladies Club.

She is survived by her husband, Mike; a son, William Barton of Denver; her parents, Mr. and Mrs. C. E. Weaver of Cheyenne; a sister and brother, Mrs. Jame Bankus and Charles Weaver, both of Denver.
