Glen Whinery of 1555 Spruce St. passed away at Memorial Hospital in Cheyenne Friday, March 9, 1979, at the age of 70.

He was born March 4, 1909 in Kansas, the son of William and Sarah Kerr. He came to Wheatland with his family in 1919 where they homesteaded on the North Laramie River. He attended school in Wheatland and as a young man worked with various blacksmiths in this area. In 1944 he built his own shop and operated his own blacksmith and repair business where Howard's Welding and Repair is now located. He sold his business and retired in 1970.

He is survived by his wife, Elizabeth Whinery of Wheatland; one son, Dean Whinery, of Wheatland; three daughters, Glenda Goetz of Wheatland, June

Coulter of Casper, and Mary Ann Riley of Ohio; one brother, Marion Whinery of Aurora, Mo.; two sisters, Rena Blavins of Aurora, Mo. and May Ison of Raytown, Mo.; and eight grandchildren and one great grandchild.
