

WICKAM, DORIS M. DRUCKER
December 12, 1918-September 16, 2007

Dorothy M. (Drucker) Wickam, 88, of Cheyenne, died Sunday, September 16, 2007 at Life Care Center in Cheyenne.

She was born December 12, 1918, near Mitchell, Nebraska.

As a youngster, her family moved to Wheatland, Wyoming where she attended school and graduated from Wheatland High School.

Dorothy married Fred Wickam on June 24, 1940 and moved to Cheyenne where they resided until 1976.

While in Cheyenne, Dorothy worked for Dr. Andrew Bunten for several years then at Chief Oil of Jack Mabee for 25 years until retiring in 1975.

She retired at the same time as Fred from the Wyoming Highway Patrol.

Together, they spent many years in California and at their son and daughter-in-law's ranch west of Glendo. In the 1980's they moved back to Wheatland. In 1996 Dorothy moved to Pointe Frontier in Cheyenne.

She was a member of the First Presbyterian Church and the Oak Leaf Chapter #6 Order of the Eastern Star.

Mrs. Wickam is survived by two sons and daughters-in-law, Gary L. and Deb Wickam of Meridian, Idaho and Alan D. and Judy Wickam of Glendo, Wyoming; a sister-in-law, Esther Wick of Garden Grove, CA; seven grandchildren, Brenton Wickam, Bryce Wickam, Cherish Novotny and her husband Justin, Faith Dalgarno, Alisha Havens, Rob Jones and Michael Jones; a great-grandson, Dalton Novotny; one nephew, Sam Drucker; three nieces, Jerra Davis, who was like a daughter and her husband Ron, Jane Harens and Katie Johnson and her husband Howard and several grand nieces and nephews.

She was preceded in death by her husband of 50 years, Fred Wickam; her parents, Henry and Anna Drucker; two sisters, Marie Johnston and Eloise Williams and one great-grandson, Noah John Novotny.

A private family graveside service will take place in Wheatland later in the week.
