

WILLIAMS, PAUL HAMILTON

May 21, 1894-May 18, 1954

Paul H. Williams, brother of Mentor R. Williams, died May 18 at Portsmouth, Ohio, as the result of an auto accident. Funeral services will be held at the Schrader chapel Sunday, May 23, at 2:00 p.m., with burial in the Wheatland cemetery. Pallbearers will be Jack White, Paul Lawrence, Gordon Drury, L.M. Strickler, Artie Sater and E.W. Schieck.

Mr. Williams had been employed as a material engineer by Peter-Kiewit and Sons company for the past fifteen years, and was working on the Portsmouth atomic energy project at the time of his death.

Paul Hamilton Williams was born near Fincastle, Ind. May 21, 1894, and was within three days of his 61st birthday when death occurred. He was the youngest son of William S. and Mary Hartman Williams. His mother died when he was a small child and his father passed away in Wheatland in 1947.

He is survived by his wife Bertha; three sons, Jack, stationed with the U.S. Navy in San Diego, Calif., Paul H., Jr. and Mentor Ralph, minor children: two daughters, Beverly of South Carolina and Virginia of Kansas City, Mo.; his brother, M.R. Williams of Wheatland and a half-sister, Mrs. Robert Pearce of Long Beach, Calif.
